He recently debuted at Theater an der Wien (L'Amor conjugale), sang Angelotti (Tosca), Papageno (Petite Flûte enchantée), and Atys (Avignon, Théâtre des Champs-Élysées). A dedicated recitalist, he won the Lied Prize at the Nadia & Lili Boulanger Competition, and the Contemporary Song Prize at the French Melodie Competition of Toulouse with the pianist Matvey Zheleznyakov.
